

INDIAN PANORAMA FILM FESTIVAL

(PUBLIC SCREENING OF INDIAN PANORAMA - 2014 FILMS)

31st January – 8th February 2015, Siri Fort Auditorium II, New Delhi

The “Indian Panorama Film Festival”, showcasing the films selected in the Indian Panorama, 2014 as part of the 45th International Film Festival of India, recently concluded in New Delhi. The festival was organized from 31st January-8th February, 2015 at Siri Fort Auditorium by Directorate of Film Festivals, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. 26 Feature Films and 15 Non-Feature Films were screened during the 8 days festival.

The festival was inaugurated by Hon’ble Minister of State for Ministry of Information and Broadcasting **Col. Rajyavardhan Rathore (Retd.), AVSM**, in the presence of **Shri Bimal Julka** Secretary, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, **Director Shri Ananth Narayan Mahadevan & Actor Shri Vinay Pathak**.

The festival opened with the Hindi feature film **GOUR HARI DASTAAN – THE FREEDOM FILE** directed by Ananth Narayan Mahadevan and produced by Siddhivinayak Cine Vision.
